Spring 2014 Proseminar Kant's Critique of Pure Reason

This course will be a student driven seminar on Kant's masterpiece, the *Critique of Pure Reason*. We will begin with a brief overview of Kant's critical philosophy and an even briefer discussion of Kant's pre-critical writings. Following this, we will explore the 'Copernican Revolution' in philosophy that Kant develops in the first *Critique*, paying special attention to Kant's theories of sensibility and understanding, his account of self-consciousness, and the distinction between phenomena and noumena. We will end by considering Kant's treatment of religion and morality in the final sections of the *Critique*, as well how Kant's philosophy has been received by both historical and contemporary critics.
